APPLYING FOR COLLEGE? YFU Asks the Experts How to Position Your Exchange for Maximum Impact

Your exchange experience changed your life, whether you went abroad or brought the world to you by hosting. If you are like most YFU participants, you grew as a person, gained a better understanding of yourself, learned a new language, and discovered a new culture. Colleges, universities, and graduate programs are eager to attract exchange alumni. To help YFU alumni get the most mileage from their exchange experience, YFU asked the advice of Kristen Schliker, Associate Director of Admissions at American University in Washington, DC, and Jill Stoffers, Director of Admissions at the Monterey Institute of International Studies (MIIS), a graduate school in California.

What is the value of a YFU exchange for a college applicant?

JILL STOFFERS: As a graduate school that prepares bilingual professionals for international careers, The Monterey Institute of International Studies have alumni who work as international practitioners who can trace the origin of their career interests to their YFU experiences. YFU literally becomes a defining moment in their lives. When we see a student has studied abroad with YFU, they are given special consideration when we award merit scholarships.

KRISTEN SCHLIKER: Any academic experience abroad is seen as an experience that strengthens the student's academic abilities. American University looks for the ways in which a student was able to expand their academic experience while abroad, whether that is by taking a different level of classes, different programs, or classes in another language. In addition, experiences that take students out of their comfort zone, allow them to gain leadership experience, and open their mind to other parts of the world and cultures are valuable, both to the students and to the college they ultimately attend.

How can applicants best position their exchange experience in their application?

JILL STOFFERS: Place the YFU experience within an overall narrative about yourself. If YFU was the starting point for an interest in international affairs – articulate that in your application essay. Then, explain how that experience is likely to define what you study in college and how it may help you achieve your longer-term career goals.

KATHERINE SCHLIKER: Applicants should be sure to highlight their abroad experience in at least one part of their application. A lot of students choose to highlight it in their essay, and that can be effective if it is done well. However, students should also be sure to list their experiences abroad in their resume/activity sheet. A letter from a school counselor can also be helpful to the colleges because it can reinforce the value of the experience abroad from a more official standpoint.

Are there any negatives to the exchange experience? What if a student scored lower on the SAT or couldn't take a required course while overseas?

KRISTEN SCHLIKER: If students are concerned about any negative effects on their academic record, they should be sure to include an explanation in their application clearly articulating why they were not able to take any required courses, or why their grades were impacted in any way. This is not to say that

students with abroad experience are not expected to have competitive academic records, but explanations can be helpful as admission officers look at the application as a whole. In short, admissions officers look at everything, and abroad experience is certainly valued, but they have high expectations for all applicants.

What advice can you offer on writing that all-important essay?

JILL STOFFERS: It is important to place all of your international experiences – YFU, your undergraduate study, your foreign language development, internships, etc –into a cohesive narrative that explains your future 1, 3 and 5 year career plans. YFU might be one line in a narrative that describes many more international-focused experiences. There is a past, present and future component to the application essay and we should be able to clearly acquire a sense for your future aspirations from it.

KRISTEN SCHLIKER: As the number of students with high school abroad experience grows, so too does the number of essays highlighting abroad experience. Some of these essays can start to sound similar so be sure that your essay is very personal to you and your experience, it shouldn't be something that any other student could write. If it is a well-written account of a personal experience that shaped you in some way, it will most likely place both you and your experience in a positive light.

TOP TIPS FOR THE COLLEGE-BOUND

Focus on the Essay: Grades and test scores only get you in the door of the admissions office. It is your essay that distinguishes you. Don't shortchange yourself!

Reveal Thyself: Admissions counselors are not telepathic—what they know about you is limited to what you tell them. Help them discover you by sharing your story, your ideas and your feelings as openly and directly as you can.

Avoid the Cliché: The exchange experience is a deep one—don't discount it by falling back on a quick and easy cliché to describe its impact. Avoid this pitfall by thinking long and hard about what your exchange really meant to you. Then dig into specific anecdotes and experiences to illustrate what you learned and discovered.

Bypass the Tourist Trap: Anyone with a passport and a credit card can tour the world's famous sights. It's a great experience, but what you have done goes way beyond the tourist experience. Turn your focus to the people, the culture, the daily experiences that only someone who has lived in another country can describe.

Look Homeward: Sometimes you have to go away to see your home clearly. It may be that the most profound discoveries from your exchange were about your own family, your community, your country. Feel free to share what you have learned and how you have changed.
